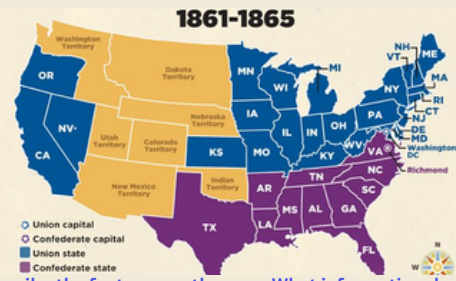


The American Civil War
